COURSE CONFIGURATION and START:

- 1. Course configuration for this event shall use the classic 1.53 mile layout.
- 2. Starting Procedures All starts will be SCCA Standard Rolling. Cars will maintain pace car speed until given the green flag. Cars which do not maintain pace car speed may be black flagged.

RACE and PIT PROCEDURES:

- 3. Pits and Grid SMOKING IS PROHIBITED. Pits and Grid areas are restricted to SCCA members who are at least 18 years of age and with appropriate credentials only. Minor Drivers are allowed to drive but not participate in other activities in these areas. Trackside signaling may be done only after all cars have taken the Green Flag. (This includes restarts.) No refueling in the pits or Grid area.
- **4. Sound Lime Rock Park track sound limitation is 103db.** Cars posting over 103db will be notified as soon as possible after the first reading.
- 5. Lights- A yellow strobe light is installed on Drivers Left approaching the uphill. It will only be used to indicate a waving yellow flag at Flag Station at top of the uphill (old Station 8). This also indicates the start of the NO Passing Zone.
- **6.** Last Lap Signal Whenever possible, the last lap in a race will be shown by the Starter displaying a sign with a number one to the field. This display, or lack thereof, is non-protestable and informational only.
- **5. Checkered Flag** A checkered flag may be displayed at additional stations to end a practice session.

RESULTS and TROPHIES and POINTS: Results will be posted at the track. Trophies will be awarded in accordance with the GCR. NERRC & NARRC points will be awarded for afternoon races only.

CANCELLATION - The event organizers reserve the right to cancel/postpone this event should circumstances beyond their control develop. When possible, all entrants will receive advance notice of such action with advice on refund arrangements

TRACK RULES - The Chief Steward has the authority and the responsibility for enforcing all rules contained in the GCR, the event Supplemental Regulations, Event Rules and the Track Specific Rules.

EVENT RULES AND PROCEDURES

REGISTRATION AND CREDENTIALS:

MotorsportReg.com is our new on-line entry system. Go to their website, create a user profile, and follow the directions to enter the race or register as a worker. More explicit directions may be found on the NESCCA website or by contacting MSR directly.

- 1. Licenses accepted per GCR 3.1.5, and valid Novice Permits per GCR Appendix C.2.7.D-F.
- 2. Drivers should ensure all information submitted to Registration on entries is current, correct and complete.
- 3. Registration Credentials All event participants must register during scheduled hours. Credentials will be issued at Registration and will not be replaced if lost. Anyone arriving after the close of registration must pay a non-refundable admission fee to the track to enter the grounds or wait until the next scheduled registration. Lost credentials will not be replaced. All participants (except those on Weekend memberships) must wear their photo ID. Vehicle passes are available at the discretion of the Registrar.
- 4. MINOR WAIVERS Minors under 18 years of age must have the appropriate SCCA Minor Waiver signed by parent or legal guardian and appropriately witnessed.
- 5. Crew The entry fee paid to New England Region permits access to the track for one driver plus **three** crew. Only the driver, entrant or crew chief can add names on the crew list.
- 6. Withdrawal of Entry and Refund A form for withdrawing an entry and receiving a refund in the event that a car cannot compete (car never sets a tire on the track) is available at Registration. The form can be used after an event by mail to the Club Racing Comptroller. Driver cancellations or withdrawals of entries must be made in writing and postmarked no later than 10 days after the event. A withdrawal fee of \$35 may be charged for withdrawal after the close of online registration.
- 7. A \$30 fee will be charged for all checks returned unpaid from the bank

PADDOCK and PIT PROCEDURES:

- 1. **Pits and Grid SMOKING IS PROHIBITED**. Trackside signaling may be done only after all cars have taken the Green Flag. (This includes restarts.) **No refueling in the pits or Grid area.**
- 2. There shall be no parking of vehicles on the paddock/road/safety access lanes during this event. All traffic signs must be obeyed. Any person operating any vehicle must operate that vehicle in a safe manner. Violations will be subject to action by the Chief Steward. Traffic in Paddock A is one-way as posted. Traffic in the Sunoco Paddock is two-way.
- 3. Radio Frequencies: Emergency Services, Race and Event Control will use the following radio frequencies for the operation of this event, 151.625 151.655 151.715 151.895 152.700 154.515 154.570 154.600.

Although the monitoring of these frequencies is acceptable, their use during the event is not allowed by anyone other than an NER designated official.

TECHNICAL AND SAFETY INSPECTION: Vehicle logbooks must be presented at Tech. Drivers are reminded that helmets must have 2012 SCCA Club sticker.

Reminder: Per GCR section 9.3.20.C.2 – All competitors are required to use approved head and neck restraint equipment.

Reminder: Per GCR section 9.3.29.D – Certain classes are required to display minimum weights on the car.

TIMING & SCORING: Reminder: Track records may only be set in Race sessions using official timing equipment when both the start and end of the timed lap are timed electronically without manual intervention.

TRANSPONDERS: are Mandatory – All cars must be equipped with a working MYLAPS/AMB Tranx260 transponder.

The Transponder # must be given to Registration. Rentals WILL NOT be available at the track.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Meetings Drivers' meetings may be called. Listen for announcements. Attendance is mandatory.
- 2. Checkered Flag A checkered flag may be displayed at additional stations to end a practice session.
- 3. Victory Laps May be allowed. No more than 2 crew members may accompany a driver on a victory lap and they must be inside the passenger compartment
- 4. Injuries To be eligible to receive medical benefits from our insurer, any participant who sustains an injury (no matter how small) must go to Race Medical and have a green card completed.
- 5. NERRC and NARRC rules are located at www.ner.org and www.nerrc.com respectively, and are also available at Registration upon request Note: All Rules and Specifications that are referenced to a website, or other means, in these Supplemental Regulations shall be those Rules and Specifications in effect at the time Registration is opened.

Track Specific Rules Lime Rock Park 2012

- 1. Open fires are not allowed anywhere on Lime Rock Park grounds (except in approved camping areas) and must be in containers designed for that purpose. Small home grills, hibachis and small gas grills are permitted in the paddocks if operated at a safe distance from any flammable sources. Lime Rock Park reserves the right to determine what a safe distance from flammable sources is and what is an acceptable grill or hibachi.
- 2. No vehicles of any kind are permitted on the Race Course without the express consent of Lime Rock Park.
- 3. In accordance with state regulations, Lime Rock Park retains the right to halt on-track activities at any point.
- 4. The operator of any vehicle, whether registered for road use or not, on access and paddock roads must hold a valid operators permit and insurance covering that vehicle.
- 5. LRP does not do not allow a non-registerable vehicle under 125cc. Vehicles such as scooters and skating systems will not be allowed to operate on the premises of Lime Rock Park, including but not limited to the Race Course or on access or paddock roads.
- 6. Bicycles are allowed in camping at all times. After 6:00pm until dark and from dawn until 7:00am, fans and participants may ride bicycles in the paddocks and on roadways. Lime Rock Park reserves the right to impound any bicycles if they are being ridden in an unsafe manner (as judged by Lime Rock Park personnel).
- 7. Alcoholic beverages are permitted in the paddocks and pits fifteen (15) minutes after on-track activity has ceased for the day and until 10:00 pm. Lime Rock Park has responsibility for ensuring compliance with policies regarding alcohol and/or other intoxicants. Lime Rock Park has the right to suspend driving privileges for any driver found to be out of compliance.
- 8. Quiet time on Lime Rock Park grounds is between 10 pm and 7am.
- 9. Weapons and fireworks are prohibited on Lime Rock Park property at all times.
- 10. Fluid wastes must be placed in approved Lime Rock Park disposal containers located at various sites in the paddocks and NEVER on the ground.

- 11. All broken vehicle parts, batteries, scrap metals, tires, etc. must be removed. Violators will be charged for the cost of removal or \$200 (whichever is greater) for each such item left on Lime Rock Park's grounds after the Event.
- 12. Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult while in the paddocks. For their safety and that of others, children must be kept under adult supervision at all times.
- 13. To facilitate emergency vehicle access, race and personal vehicles must not be parked on any paddock road/safety access lane during the event. Any vehicle not in compliance will be towed at violator's expense.
- 14. No vehicles, equipment, trucks or trailers may be brought into or left in the facility prior to the start of the event. Please contact Lime Rock Park prior to the Event regarding any special circumstances.
- 15. Traffic in A Paddock is directional one way and limited to 5 MPH. Traffic in Sunoco Paddock is two-way and is limited to 5 MPH.
- 16. Participants and/or guests desiring an electrical hookup must not have cords cross or impede any roadway or access area where vehicles or pedestrians cross, unless cords are covered with town and state approved safety cover (e.g. "yellow jacket", "speed bump").
- 17. Due to Connecticut law and DEP regulations, no car washing is permitted anywhere at Lime Rock.
